The protesters had to resort to closing down Gallaudet in acts of civil disobedience, in order to send a wake-up call to the appropriate government officials in government so that justice may be finally achieved—and Jordan has no one else to blame but himself for being the cause.

The intimidation and fear that he has used to wield power has created this situation. Jordan's chickens are now coming home to roost.
